The grade ones are also working on writing 1-2 sentences independently, sounding out words is always so exciting! We have also been reading lots of Christmas stories and doing some lovely crafts/art projects. The students are excited to perform at the Christmas concert and have been working hard practicing their little song.

- Grade 5/6 Band will be playing Hot Cross Buns and Good King Wenceslas in the Christmas concert on Dec. 14. They should be taking their instruments home and practicing.
- Grade 5-6 Skating Days: December 5, 12, 18; leaving school at 9:50 and returning at 12:00. Forms for student participation, need to be completed prior to the skating days on your Power School Parent Portal. Students need to bring their own skates and must wear a helmet.
- In ELA we will continue reading aloud with our grade 2 buddies on day 1's in December. We will
 also be looking at oration and examining non-fiction forms of writing including: speeches, letters,
 Instructions, and descriptions. We will continue to build vocabulary using Words Their Way,
 analyze organization of ideas in media and writing, and listen to reading with Gordon Kormon's
 book Masterminds.
- In Science we will continue studying Flight: experimenting with paper airplane design, examining aircraft control surfaces, describing helicopter flight and propellers, and revisiting Bernoulli's principle and forces of lift, thrust, gravity, and drag.
- In Social Studies we continue to look at modern democracy focusing in December on forms of local government.


