Congratulations to our Griffins Basketball team for winning the Bronze medal in their league!

Now that April has begun, we are ready to finish up Quarter 3 which ends on Thursday, April 14. The last quarter of the year, Quarter 4, begins on Tuesday, April 19th.

Quarter 3 questions for parents: (Some answers will depend on the age of your child.)

- ★ Are you well aware of your child's current academic progress at school?
- ★ Do you talk to your children about their learning and their school work?
- ★ Are your children aware of their recent marks on assignments, guizzes, projects, etc?
- ★ Do you review completed work, projects, assignments with your child when they bring them home?
- ★ Do you set learning goals with your child to help them stay on track with their school work?
- ★ Are your children aware of what they need to do at home to improve their learning? (practice questions, play a card game to practice their skills, re-do assignments, read their textbook, practice math facts, study for tests, etc.)
- ★ Are you in contact with your child's teacher if you have questions about your child's school work?
- ★ Does your child experience books and stories by reading or being read to every night?
- ★ Do you know your username and password for the Parent Portal in PowerSchool?
- ★ Do you regularly check your students' academic progress through PowerSchool?

Quarter 3 summaries of student learning will be online in PowerSchool for you to view by **Friday, April 22**.

We are currently planning a Celebration of Learning for our Griffins and their parents on **Thursday, April 28th, between 4:30 and 7:30 p.m.** This will be an in-person event if it is still safe to gather at that time. You will receive more information later this month about booking a time to come into the school with your child to see their classroom and some of their recent school work. We will limit the number of students and parents in the classrooms and school to keep everyone safe. As well, you will have the chance to sign up for some time with office staff if you require assistance in navigating the parent portal of PowerSchool. This event will be changed or canceled if needed, depending on the Covid situation at that time.

If you have students in grades K - 6 add the date **May 2** to your calendar! GS is hosting an **online Family Literacy Night** that evening. This is an evening of fun learning for you and your children. There will be an online session at 6:00 - 6:50 p.m. for grades K - 3 followed by a session for grades 4 - 6 at 6:55 - 7:45 p.m. This event is provided through a company called Box Cars and One Eyed Jacks. The \$10 kit of materials for the sessions will be provided free by the school. Families can keep the materials after the sessions to continue their learning and fun at home!
