Math 6, 7, 8 with Mrs Langford

We are well into our first units in all of our math classes! We have been busy starting routines in math such as daily warm up, and we have even tried out vertical math surfaces a few times!

Math 6 has been exploring positive and negative numbers, number lines, and most recently have been looking at Quadrant one on the Cartesian plane, and how to graph coordinates.

In Math 7, we are currently working on our graphing unit, and have completed a graphing my name activity, and most recently started learning Transformations. This week's transformation on the graph was translating. We will be looking at reflections and rotations in the next few weeks.

In Math 8, we started the year off with square roots, perfect squares, and Pathagorean Theorem. It is a shorter unit that we should be wrapping up in about a week. Our second unit will focus on Integers.

This year the students in grades 7 & 8 at GS have the opportunity to participate in the Student Leadership Team as a CTF option. This allows the team to have dedicated time weekly to create and develop fun and exciting activities for all Grtiffins.

- View change and the art of letting go as avenues for new areas of personal growth and self-reflection



Hello Everyone!


