Facilities & Finance Committee

- Mr. Benji Waser, CPA CA Partner, Meyers Norris Penny LLP, presented the draft Audited Financial Statements as of August 31, 2023, to the Board. Mr. Waser shared that, in his opinion, all significant aspects of the financial statements accurately reflect the financial position of Wetaskiwin Regional Public Schools as of August 31, 2023. The Board of Trustees approved the Audited Financial Statements and directed the administration to post the documents on the Division's website.

- The Board has been installing additional flagpoles across the Division in order to respectfully fly the Treaty Six Territory flag, which aligns with the Board of Trustees' priority to 'Demonstrate our commitment to Truth and Reconciliation and the spirit of the Calls to Action both which represent the beliefs and natural laws since time immemorial.' - As part of the Board's priority to 'Commit to learning about how Treaty language and the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action should guide our governance decisions, practices and relationships,' the Committee received professional development in the area of Indigenous Foundational Knowledge.
